#### **New Year's Eve and Day**

(31th December, 1st January)

- Traditional celebration at Trafalgar Square,
  London
- Street parties in Edinburgh
- In Scotland is called Hogmanay
- Everybody joins hands and sings Auld Lang
  Syne by Robert Burns, Scottish poet
- "first footing" (Scotland, the north of England)
- New Year's resolutions

#### **Shrove Tuesday**

- = Pancake Day
- The day before Easter Lent starts (40 days)
- Two events are held in Britain:
  - the pancake tossing contest
  - the pancake race







#### St. Patrick's Day

(17th March)

- A public holiday in Northern Ireland
- A festival in honour of the Irish patron St. Patrick.
- Everything is green on this day
- Symbols of the day are shamrocks and harps

#### Good Friday, Easter Sunday and Monday

- Only Friday and Monday are the public holidays
- Good Friday commemorates Christ's crucifixion. People eat hot cross buns.

Easter Sunday – chocolate Easter eggs hunt

Schools close for two weeks at Easter

#### May Day

(1st Monday in May)

- A public holiday
- Associated with ancient folklore (not with the workers)
- A pagan festival to celebrate the end of winter
- A custom is dancing round a maypole





#### The Queen's Official Birthday

(the 2nd Saturday in June)

- Nickname: Trooping the colour
- This is not her real birthday but the official one when she celebrates this in public
- There are some public ceremonies, marching, military music, soldiers in colourful uniforms.





# Halloween (31<sup>st</sup> October)

- Pagan festival celebrates the return of the souls of the dead
- In Scotland, Northern Ireland, the north of England
- Fancy dress parties (witches, ghosts, devils, bats, skeletons)
- "Trick or treat"
- "Jack-o-lantern"

#### **Guy Fawkes Night**

(5th November)

- In 1605 a group of Catholics planned to blow up the Houses of Parliament and the king James I
- Conspiracy was revealed, rebels were executed, Guy Fawkes quartered
- People celebrate by setting off fireworks and burning the models of GF on bonfires
- Nickname: Bonfire Night





#### **Remembrance Sunday**

(the 2nd Sunday in November)

- Nickname: Poppy Day
- Originated from Amistice Day (11 November 1918)
  which marked the end of the 1st WW
- Money is raised in the streets charitable purpose
- Symbol: red/white paper poppy
- At 11 a.m. Ceremony at the Cenotaph







#### Other special occasions

- St. Valentine's Day (14 February)
- Mother's Day (the 4th Sunday in Lent)
- Father's Day (3rd Sunday in June)
- April Fools' Day (1st April)
- Spring Bank Holiday (a public holiday, last Monday in May)
- Summer Bank Holiday (a public holiday, the last Monday in August)
- St. Andrew's Day (a public holiday in Scotland, 30th November)
- Christmas Eve (24th December) and Christmas Day (a public holiday, 25th December)
- Boxing Day (a public holiday, 26th December)



When is the Pancake Day celebrated?

The day before Easter Christian fast /40 days long/ starts.
